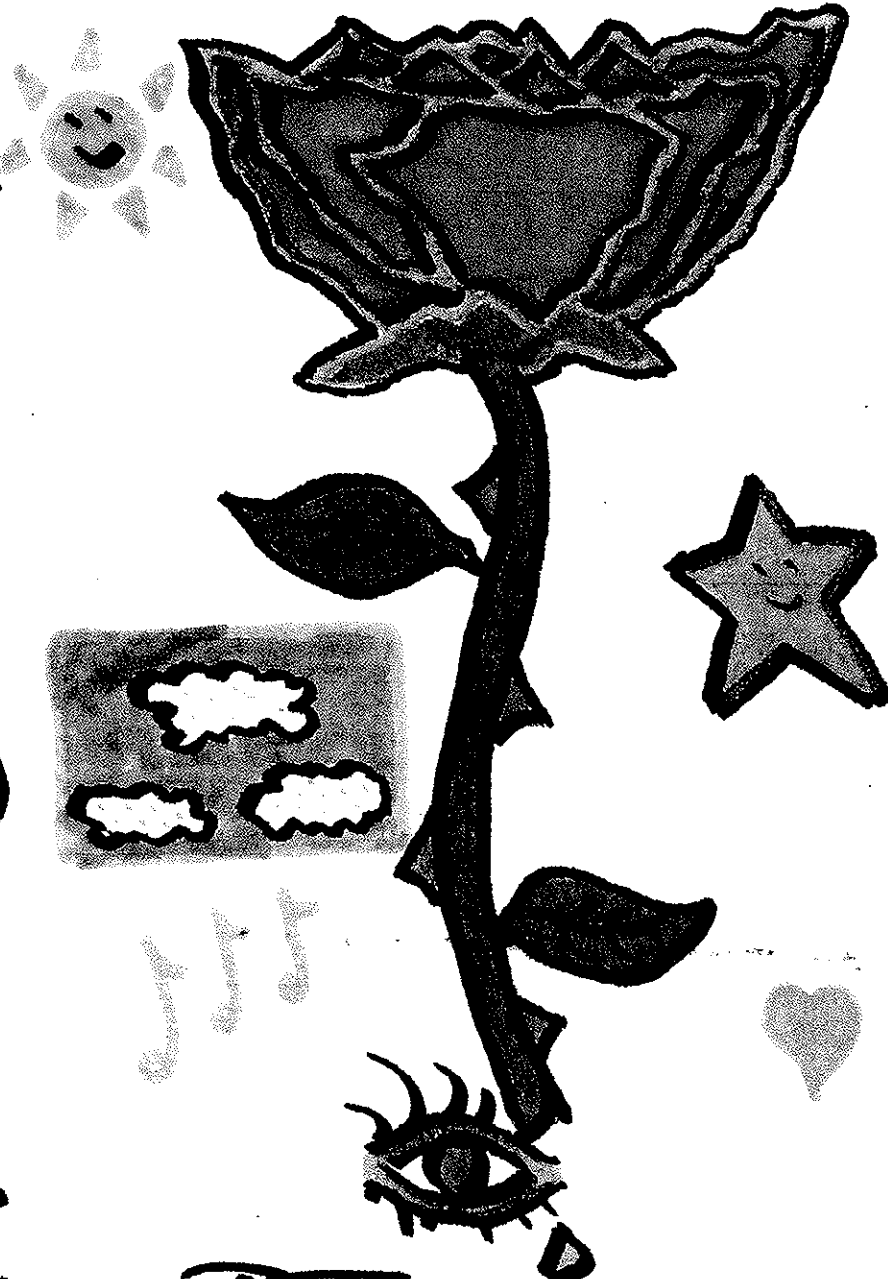

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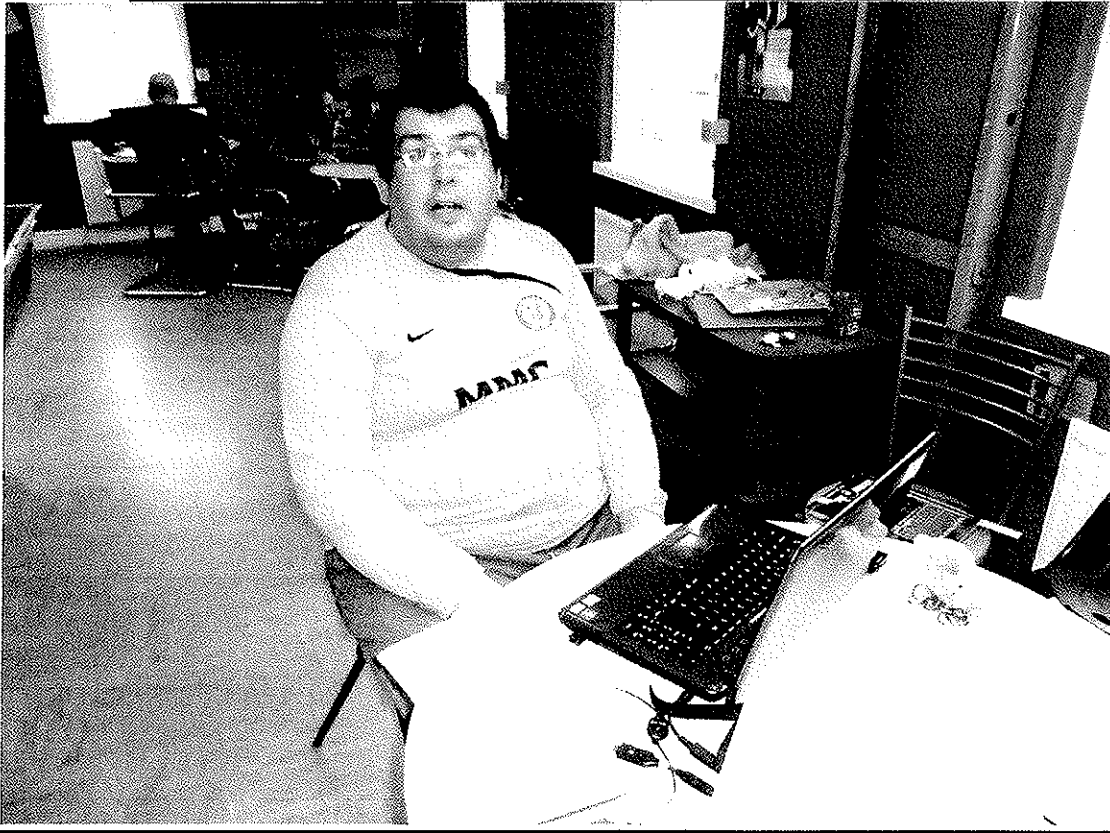
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# my petrus story

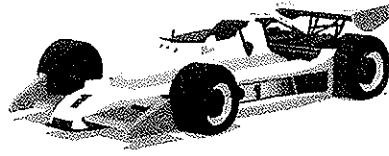

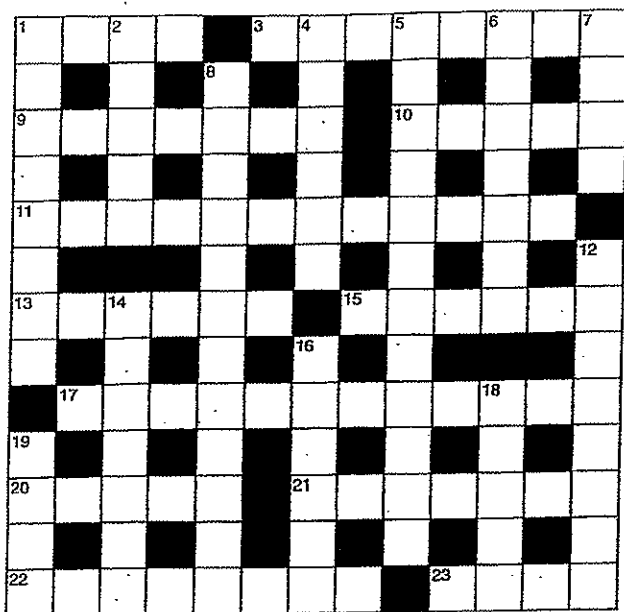
Jenson Button

My Championship Year Foreword Jenson came into Formula One at the start of the 2004 season under the spotlight and he made an impression in his early days, finishing in a very credible eighth position in the Drivers Championship in his first season. You could see instantly the young and talented driver competently that Jenson was a fast driver and Britain to have such a young and talented driver in Formula One. I was working at Ferrari at the time and I only really saw Jenson from a distance. I've had the opportunity to get to know him well whilst we have been working together over the team would tell me. You haven't seen what Jenson can really do. What I have experienced this is Jenson operating at the top of his game and able to show his talent in a good car. Jenson is an incredibly smooth driver. His driving looks so controlled, which is impressive when you know how difficult Formula One cars can be to handle. He's very easy on the car and his smooth style looks after the tyres, but he is aggressive and assertive in his racing and very capable of holding his own on the track.

For me, the highlights of Jenson's season would be the impressive six in the first seven races. Each win was an achievement. Whilst Australia and Monaco stand out for our one-two finishes, I thought Jenson drove exceptionally in Barcelona to take the win at the Spanish Grand Prix. Some of his wins might have looked straightforward but it was far from the case. Jenson was faced with not only a race-winning and vastly experienced team-mate in Rubens Barrichello, who had the same equipment as him, but also two very strong Red Bull cars driven by Sebastian Vettel and Mark Webber. Until this season, Jenson hadn't fought for a Championship for a long time. He had a good year in 2004 but it was more about the race results than a potential title challenge. This year has been different. In any Championship season, you have strong periods and challenging times. One of the most impressive qualities which Jenson has shown has his ability to deal with both with both scenarios and handle the attention which has come his way. He has maintained his controlled and measured approach when we were faced with races where our only objective was to consolidate and score a point or two. To achieve the results on the difficult days, when a couple of points is the full potential of the car, is what really counts in a Championship season and Jenson fully deserves the achievement of his first Drivers' Championship title. Jenson is a straightforward guy. He's easy to work with and good company away from the track. He has his priorities sorted. Motor racing comes first but he enjoys life, much as I do, by keeping a balance and a strong circle of family and friends in this very intense world that we live and work in. 2009 has been an incredible year for Jenson and for Brawn GP. I hope you enjoy reading about the highs and lows, the victories and challenges, the on-track action and the off-track stories of a wonderful season of Formula One racing.

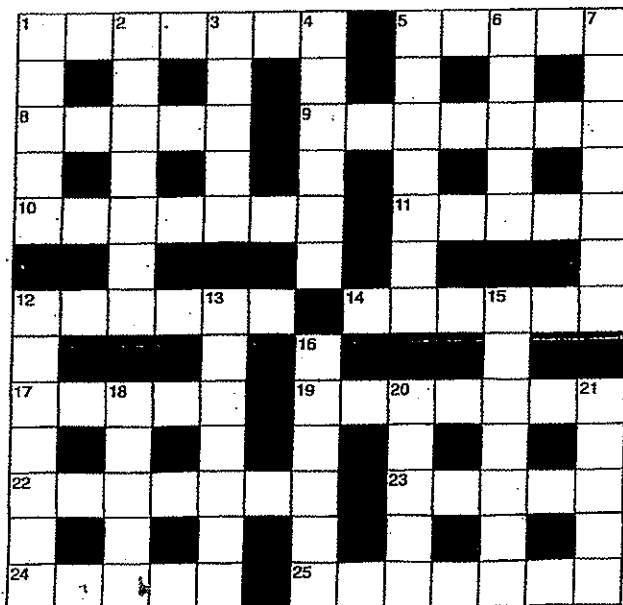

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# upside down pineapple cake

## RECIPES

### Upside down pineapple cake

#### Ingredients

6oz self raising flour

6oz sugar

6oz butter

3 medium eggs

Small tin of pineapple rings

#### METHOD

1. Preheat oven to gas mark 5
2. mix butter and sugar till creamy
3. then mix the flour in and mix all together-whisk for 5 minutes
4. mix 1 egg into the mixture then repeat with the other 2 eggs and mix all together
5. put grease proof paper in a round tin
6. put pineapple rings in the greaseproof tin. Pour the mixture over the pineapple rings and smooth it out.
7. put the tin in the oven for 20mins then check whether it is set. If the mixture is not set pat back in the oven. Till set for another 5 mins

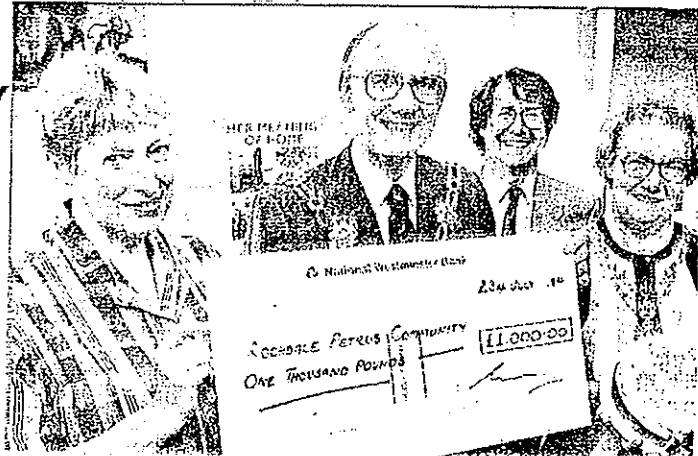

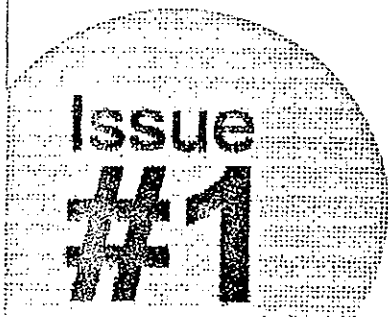
